- Gain a basic understanding of university structure
- Identify campus resources and provide appropriate referral information

AN ORIENTATION LEADER!

The Division of University College is recruiting several students to become Orientation Leaders (OLs). Orientation Leaders are current students who help new & transfer students take the first steps toward a successful college career.

What Will I Do?

Orientation Leaders lead a group of new students and their parents to multiple sessions throughout a New Student Orientation Session. Orientation Leaders lead tours, conduct presentations, and answer questions to help new students, and their guests, transition to IUPUC. There will be extensive training sessions to help you learn the material prior to the start of the orientation season.

What are the Requirements?

A positive attitude and school spirit is a must!

It is also important for you to feel comfortable interacting with others and speaking in front of a small group. You must be a *current IUPUC student with a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.500.

*enrolled as an IUPUC student in Spring 2019 and returning in Fall 2019

What is the Schedule & Pay?

Orientation Leaders are paid \$10.15/hour. Applicants do NOT need to be work-study eligible. There are 5 scheduled Orientations from June-August. (See attached sheet for details). There is 1 additional new student event scheduled for Tuesday, August 13th, as well as additional orientation opportunities in January, and other orientation related events throughout fall and spring semesters.

Orientation Leaders report to work approximately one hour prior to orientations and continue to work until about 30 minutes after the session ends (for a total of about 6-7 hours per orientation). OLs are **required** to attend four paid training sessions prior to the first orientation. During training, OLs will be provided all the information and tools they need in order to be ready for summer orientations.

Since we have a number of orientations scheduled during the summer, we understand that applicants may not be available for all the orientations due to summer classes. We encourage you to still apply even if you will not be able to attend all orientations, but please understand that preference will be given to students who can attend the most orientation sessions.

What is in it for ME?

Orientation Leaders help to foster a sense of trust and confidence within their groups of students, which in many cases leads to long-term friendships between them. In many ways, an Orientation Leader can have an everlasting effect on a student, and provide him or her with an experience they will most likely never forget. This is a great opportunity to gain experience, improve your communication techniques, and add leadership skills to your resume.
